Knightdale Citizens Police Academy Begins

The Knightdale Police Department is continuing a program designed to give its citizens and area business owners a chance to develop a better understanding of the services provided by the agency. Are We Humans Rational? Are We Logical?

We humans can certainly be both rational and logical, if we are careful and train ourselves to correct thinking - backed by facts.

Alas, strange as may sound, most of the time we are not rational. It is easier to be logical; and most of the time we are.

Let me explain. Often the decisions made for action as a group, leadership, or as individuals, while most of the time perfectly logical as to the practical steps needed to accomplish them, are often not rational.

If we define rational as the correct assessment of a situation and what response is needed to the posed challenge by it, in that area as humans we have trouble doing that. Big trouble. Here is why: humans are guided by promptings from inside originating from our traits embedded in our brain, often ignoring facts and realities. There are plenty of examples: Horrible as it is for our victims by a few terrorists, there were only 30 of our people killed by them in the last 10 years. During the same time, 400,000 of our people died in car accidents and another 400,000 died of gun violence; yet, many of us are feeling as if terrorists are overrunning our country!

In political years candidates of all parties, know that; so, they talk in emotional tribal code, such as: "They are coming!" "Our country is going down!" And we fall for it and get agitated irrationally, while we are overlooking that the candidates do not back their slogans with facts.

We also as humans make mistakes due to the bias of our human nature, often ignoring, time after time, the possible future bad outcomes for decisions and irrational actions taken. There exists an unwillingness in us also to contemplate worst case scenario outcomes.

We are by our nature short in foresight. Worse we often persist in the action even though it becomes obvious as to the harm being done in continuing it. Leadership, organized groups, and ourselves as individuals, act frequently against our self interest. The most tragic example: the Vietnam war. It lasted 20 years while we knew that there was not any satisfactory outcome.

On an individual basis; we all know that eating greasy food is bad for us. We irrationality ignore this fact and over-eat greasy food any way!

Note that Barbara Tuchman, a great scholar call it "Wood-headedness" in her notable book, The March Of Folly, while the

name for it: Akrasia — acting against ones' interest.

We have to learn to protect ourselves from irrationality by asking for facts, facts, facts, and then learning to think for ourselves, coolly setting aside tribal emotionality.


